Our students come from an impoverished area in the capital city of Kampala. While there are many secondary schools located in the city, we believe that a boarding school outside the teeming metropolis provides a more conducive environment for academic success and personal discipline. Girls and boys in their teens are susceptible to economic, social, and sexual exploitation. These temptations abound in an urban environment. Our students attend

a boarding secondary school located in a rural area about forty-five

minutes from Kampala, far from its smog and urban blight.

In addition to being able to concentrate on their studies without pressure to do household chores, students can also partake of a variety of extracurricular activities, including sports, music, dance, drama, and clubs. The school attracts learners from other parts of Uganda, and this diverse culture socializes the children to overcome traditional regional and tribal biases. One day each academic term is set aside for a special parents visitation day. It's an opportunity to meet with our students as a group, provide snacks, offer advice, and review individual academic performance.

On her recent report card, Rose was the top student in her class of 65 and our best performing student in primary school with an average grade of 94%.
